Dear Church Family,

Evangelism is not about what other people can do for our church. Yes, our sanctuary looks a bit sparse on Sunday mornings and it would feel better to us to have more people there. And yes, our budget is tight and it would be nice if those same more people would help us out financially. But neither of those things – filling the pews and filling the coffers of the church – have anything to do with sharing the good news of the gospel. The good news is not about what other people might/can/should do for us. It is about letting others in on the great thing we have found – the love of God. We have found out and firmly believe that God loves us, intends goodness and joy for us. These lives we have been given are meant to be meaningful, happy, worthy and connected to the source of that joy – God in Christ. This love is such good news that we should be bubbling over with the joy of it, sharing this marvelous love that has discovered us.

There are however, many reasons we choose not to talk about our faith. We don't want to be associated with high pressure tactics; we don't want our friends to think we are foolish or uncool; we don't want to seem nosy about or disrespectful of other peoples' choices. Pride, embarrassment, fear, sin, get in the way of the conversations that share our faith. And despite the many hours and great devotion to our church, we say nothing to our family and friends about what we believe and why the church is important in our lives.

The love of God is not something that should, or even can, be contained in our small church building. I encourage you in the coming season of Advent and Christmas, to tell somebody you care about, or even somebody you just met, about your faith. Say something about the love of God given us in the birth of Jesus into the world. Tell about the joy of being so very well loved by God.


Carillon Repaired

Meyersville Church Book Club

Friday, December 12, 7:30 p.m.

The Meyersville Church Book Club will be meeting at 7:30 pm on Friday, December 12th. For our discussion, to which all are welcome, we will be branching out into the world of non-fiction to read Jill Lepore's biography of Benjamin Franklin's sister, *Book of Ages: The Life and Opinions of Jane Franklin*. From the *Booklist* review:



Award-winning historian, Harvard professor, and New Yorker staff writer Lepore, was intrigued to learn that Benjamin Franklin and his youngest sister, Jane, were so close they were called Benny and Jenny. Renowned, world-traveling brother and obscure, homebound sister exchanged loving, newsy, bantering letters for more than 60 years. Most of his were preserved, while three decades' worth of hers disappeared. This near-erasure, along with the gender bias that determined the vast differences in the siblings' education, opportunities, and experiences, become as much a focus in this zestfully rigorous portrait as Jane herself. The most poignant artifact Lepore unearthed was Jane's handmade "Book of Ages," recording the birth of her 12 children and, excruciatingly, the eventual deaths of all but one of them. In spite of the tragedies she endured, Jane's surviving letters are "gabby, frank, and vexed," the correspondence of a smart, witty, hardworking woman who "loved best books about ideas," reveled in gossip, expressed "impolite" opinions on religion and politics, and shared piquant observations of the struggle for American independence.

December Special Mission

The Session has decided to change our special mission for the month of December to focus on water supply mechanisms of various sorts in order to help families in different parts of the world to have the clean water essential to life and health. Depending on the funds we raise, we will choose as many of the systems below as we can.



\$65 TREADLE PUMP

Crop irrigation is a primary concern for farmers around the world. Without water, crops will wither and die, leaving behind starving communities. One treadle pump can help ensure that these precious crops will come to harvest.



\$75 RAINWATER CATCHMENT SYSTEM

For many, water is hard to find. Access to water in homes is even rarer. Our donation means that a family in Central America gets a connection to a potable water system in their own home. Rainwater can be a precious resource when collected, stored, and filtered properly.



\$500 SAND DAM

Sand dams are a simple yet effective way to provide clean water for an entire community. A concrete wall is built across a seasonal riverbed, and sand fills in behind it - trapping rainwater. An average sand dam can store millions of gallons of water for years, and provide water for drinking and/or irrigation even when droughts occur.
